



# Good Tidiness

*THESE CLEAN-LINED FIXTURES AND FURNISHINGS HELP BRING DOMESTIC BLISS TO THE MOST ESSENTIAL ROOMS IN THE HOUSE.*

01 Chicago-based designer Felicia Ferrone's latest collaboration with Italian kitchen-and-bath specialist Boffi elevates the standard mirror into something resembling an ultra-minimal sculpture that protrudes from the wall. The Index's simple stainless-steel geometry provides a circular frame for the looking glass, which reverses to reveal a magnifier on the other side.

02 The ancient art of calligraphy inspired the sink collection Inkstone, designed by Hong Kong-based architect and interior decorator Steve Leung for Italian brand Neutra. Leung translated the container used to grind the form's ink sticks into a series of wash basins available in nine types of natural stone.



03 The incredibly durable surfaces of Oki Sato's Stone Garden are the result of Caesarstone's patented process, which combines polymers and pigments with a material that's over 90 percent quartz. Nendo's chief designer teamed up with the manufacturer to create a collection of 222 variations of the naturally hued, pebble-shaped tables, sold in limited-edition clusters.

04 Freestanding tubs rank high on the fantasy bathroom must-have list, especially when crafted with the smart ergonomics of Pear Cut. Patricia Urquiola's latest for Agape is composed of the bio-based material Cristalplant, and comes in all-white or white with a contrasting dark-gray bowl.

05 Affordable high-design has made its way into the most intimate space in the house. Sydney-born, London-based designer Marc Newson has created a collection of bathroom furnishings for Caroma, including clean-lined taps, toilets, tubs, wash basins, and even a super-simple urinal.

06 Quadtwo is an evolution of Boffi's original Quad basin, further refined to suit bathrooms with limited storage space. Jeffrey Bennett of New York's Consultants for Design Strategy added drawers to the unit's front and side panels, allowing for discreet spots to keep toiletries on hand.
