CENTREPIECE

The free-standing bath continues to be the focal point, with no shortage of modern and classic styles to choose from. Composites (made from powdered stone and resin) are warm to the touch, much lighter than traditional materials and offer increased design possibilities. Take a look at baths by Victoria + Albert for their elegant shapes and often impossibly slim profiles, while the Duo Vasca collection by Neutra (Duo Vasca bath above), is striking for its harmonious pairing of rich walnut grain and stone.



DRESS TO IMPRESS

Larger-scale bathrooms can incorporate a dressing area complete with storage and full-length mirrors. Add a seat or an ottoman, upholstered in an outdoor fabric to resist moisture, plus a decorative mirror such as the Matilda (above), £1,065, by Porta Romana. Clad walls in antiqued mirroring, which will boost the light without feeling harsh.
